

MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERS


The Children's Board has been investing in children and families for more than 35 years, and we continue to evolve to better respond to the needs of Hillsborough County. We celebrated significant growth in 2024, funding 22 additional programs as well as expansion of 16 programs through an additional funding opportunity.

Funded programs work to support a variety of outcomes in four strategic areas, all measured through a results-based accountability evaluation process. In 2024, our programs met or exceeded eighty-four percent of these outcomes, an increase in six percent over last year! We are particularly proud of the Early Childhood Education area of Ready to Learn and Succeed, in which all outcomes were met. This continues to be an area of increased concentration, as we strive toward improved Kindergarten readiness rates in Hillsborough County in collaboration with community partners.

Support for concrete needs is at an all-time high, as parents struggle to cover the basics for their children. The Children's Board responded, by adding seven family support programs and increasing flexible funding through our Administrative Services Organization (ASO) to address service gaps and stabilize families. All outcomes in the *Family Support* area were also met or exceeded in 2024.

We thank our dedicated Board of Directors, Children's Board team members, and the 700+ grant-funded program staff at our partner agencies for keeping children at the forefront. Our investments support a healthier, safer community for all of us, and we are honored to serve Hillsborough County families through our wide array of funded programs and seven Children's Board Family Resource Centers.



Both ethnicity percentages were reported at **46%** but race composition varied within each ethnicity



Map based on **52,659** children and family members residing in **87** zip codes in Hillsborough County.




FUNDING IMPAC

In 2024, the Children's Board successfully led the largest funding release in its 37 year history. \$32.5M was allocated across all four focus areas to support universal access to services throughout our community.

In addition, we have seen the growth in our Ready to Learn and Succeed focus area which spans services for professionals and families with children birth to middle school age. Our commitment to strengthening funded programs, community stakeholders, and local systems of care providers contributes to the successes of this past year.



The Children's Board strategically invests in quality programs and best practices to achieve key results in four focus areas, helping children and families in Hillsborough County thrive. We partner with funded agencies to support participants in reaching these goals.










COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS



The Administrative Services Organization (ASO), a dedicated source of flexible funds, was created in 2003 to support family directed care. The ASO promotes a wraparound approach where families and their case managers develop family support plans that identify their strengths, needs, and goals. Families prioritize the most critical services and select qualified community providers to aid them in meeting their goals. ASO funds purchase these services when no other funding or resources are available to meet these needs.

SUMMER PASSPORTS

The Children's Board Summer Passport program provides youth in Hillsborough County, aged 6 to 14, with one-time scholarships for summer camps. These scholarships enable children to participate in high-quality programming in Hillsborough County without placing a financial strain on their families.

This summer, 387 participants enjoyed one or two weeks of camps at a variety of exciting venues, such as Tampa Theatre, the Straz Center for the Performing Arts, Zoo Tampa, Glazer Children's Museum, the Museum of Science and Industry (MOSI), and the Lightning Foundation.

Summer Services grants present a distinctive opportunity for non-profit organizations to secure funding aimed at improving their summer programs. For the past nine years, the Children's Board has worked with the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners to offer these grants specifically for summer programs catering to youth aged 6-14. In 2024, Summer Services grants supported six non-profits.
