The Children’s Board, established in 1988 to invest local tax dollars in programs that help children lead healthy, safe, and productive lives, remains committed to early intervention and prevention for Hillsborough’s families. In 2025, we supported 167 programs and partnerships, including 12 new initiatives and several expansions, reflecting our continued response to the county’s growth and evolving family needs.

We engaged in a strategic planning process informed by the Board of Directors and community input. Through this work, we updated our service priorities and advanced key initiatives to modernize operations, strengthen provider support, and enhance community engagement. Our updated priorities include expanding summer camp access, enhancing support for early learning, increasing services for teens, bolstering mental health wellness, and providing specialized assistance for children with varying abilities. Implementation of these priorities began in 2025 and continues through targeted funding opportunities in 2026.






Gender

Race/Ethnicity



Number of records in zip code: 1 3,814


Most frequently reported zip codes








Developmentally on Track







Community Investments

The Administrative Services Organization (ASO), a dedicated source of flexible funds, was created in 2003 to support family-directed care. The ASO promotes a wraparound approach in which families and their case managers develop family support plans that identify their strengths, needs, and goals. Families prioritize the most critical services and select qualified community providers to help them meet their goals. ASO funds are used to purchase these services when no other funding or resources are available to meet these needs.
